The sports premium is money given to the school by the Department for Education to improve the provision of sport and PE in primary schools in a sustainable way. It can only be spent on PE and Sport.

How the school used this funding:

Approximate amount	Type of use	Intended Impact
£3000	Specialist Coaching to each year group over the year	To enhance skills training for all pupils from specialist coaches, teachers in attendance learning coaching skills for long term impact/sustainability.
£300	Tutor costs for additional swimming sessions	To increase percentage of children being able to swim 25m in Year 4, and to increase percentage of children attaining the objectives set out from the ASA Learn to Swim Framework stages 1-7.
£1000	Specialist Athletics coaching for Y6 over the year	More skilled preparation for Olympics event, to enable children to perform with confidence
£1800	Curriculum Equipment	To enhance provision of sports equipment, more equipment available for PE lessons, Sports Leader lunchtime sessions and sports clubs.
£1500	Teaching cover costs to enable training, sports development management, etc	Further develop effective leadership of PE/Sports in school, more skilled teachers after attending training
£1000	Teaching Assistant attendance and support at after school clubs for younger pupils	Enable greater participation of younger children at out of school clubs
£600	Transport costs for additional swimming sessions	To increase percentage of children being able to swim 25m in Year 4, and to increase percentage of children attaining the objectives set out from the ASA Learn to Swim Framework stages 1-7.
£750	Track hire and coach costs for cluster Olympics day at Bedford International Stadium	To enable all Y6 to partake in cluster Olympic competition at a professional stadium
£500	Training	To enhance sports provision across the school, enhance staff confidence and skills
£1035	Specialised kit with full wicking properties	To encourage and enthuse children to take part in more Cluster Sport competitions throughout the year
£800.00	Specialised Athletics equipment	Children feel more confident and more tactically aware for how they can improve their athletic skills.

The school has established a comprehensive array of sports clubs run by external providers. For some of these, the coaches are funded by the school and small fees are payable to attend (with some free places provided).
