

## Sports Premium 2015-16

The sports premium is money given to the school by the Department for Education to improve the provision of sport and PE in primary schools in a sustainable way. It can only be spent on PE and Sport.

### Sport Premium Received September 2015 to August 2016: **£9,830**

How the school used this funding:

Approximate amount	Type of use	Impact
£3456	Specialist Coaching to each year group over the year	All children experienced high quality PE sessions in a range of sports. As a result, children developed their tactical and spatial awareness. Teaching staff are also more confident in the delivery of PE sessions after obtaining a wide range of ideas to challenge pupils observed from the coaches.
£340	Tutor costs for additional swimming sessions	84% of Y4 children can now swim more than 25m in a swimming pool (73% in 2015).
£1000	Specialist Athletics coaching for Y6 over the year	92% of Y6 children engaged in the Cluster Olympics event at the end of the year. They could all explain an approach for how they could improve further (68% in 2015).
£1423	Curriculum Equipment	Children from KS1 and KS2 are more actively involved in a wider range of sports such as table tennis and athletics. Sports leaders are leading Level 1 (table tennis) games with children on a weekly basis. Teaching staff and coaches also have the necessary equipment needed to engage, motivate and develop skills in PE.
£1500	Teaching cover costs to enable training, sports development management, etc	More effective leadership of PE/Sports in school, more skilled teachers after attending training.
£396	Teaching Assistant attendance and support at after school clubs for younger pupils	The extra support has allowed more KS1 children (including those with SEN) to participate in after school clubs.
£630	Transport costs for additional swimming sessions	84% of children can now swim more than 25m in a swimming pool.
£607	Track hire and coach costs for cluster Olympics day at Bedford International Stadium	Enabled Y6 squad and spectators to partake in cluster Olympic competition at a professional stadium.
£360	Training	Sports and PE leaders have enhanced strategic overview of this subject.

£1029	Specialised kit with full wicking properties	More children were motivated, inspired and took pride in representing the school at cluster competitions across the year.
£898.00	Specialised Athletics equipment	Children are now more confident and tactically aware for how they can improve their running/hurdling skills.

The school has established a comprehensive array of sports clubs run by external providers.
