

Sports Premium 2017-18

The sports premium is money given to the school by the Department for Education to improve the provision of sport and PE in primary schools in a sustainable way. It can only be spent on PE and Sport.

Sport Premium Allocation September 2017 to August 2018: c£18,000

How the school intends to use this funding:

Approximate amount	Type of use	Intended Impact
£12000	Outdoor Gym Equipment	Increased fitness activities during break times, lunchtimes and PE lessons. Sustainable outcomes with equipment lifespan of 10 years +
£1250	Curriculum Equipment	Enhanced provision of sports equipment, more equipment available for PE lessons and sports clubs.
£1400	Teaching cover costs to enable training, sports development management, Level 2/Level 3 tournaments, etc	More effective leadership of PE/Sports in school, more skilled teachers after attending training. More children can compete in Level 2/Level 3 competitions.
£400	Specialist coaches to run after-school clubs in specific sports/skills*	To promote the use of after-school clubs to boost participation levels across KS1 and KS2.
£450	Training	Enhanced sports provision across the school, enhanced staff confidence and skills.
£3500	Specialised Supervision from a qualified coach at lunchtimes	More children are responsible for organising and leading the sports zones.
£750	Coaching, transport and venue hire for Cluster Olympics	All 60 Y6 pupils have opportunity to take part in track and field events at specialist stadium

The school has established a comprehensive array of sports clubs run by external providers.
